Prof Maureen Dollard is Professor of Work and Organisational Psychology and Director of the Asia Pacific Centre for Work Health and Safety, a World Health Organization Collaborating Centre in Occupational Health at the University of South Australia. Her main research focus is on psychosocial safety climate for psychological health in organisations, and interventions for psychosocial risk, and she has published numerous books and papers in the area. She established the national surveillance project, the Australian Workplace Barometer, has extensive experience with industry partners, and has won numerous research grants awarded by the Australian Research Council.

Maureen is on the Editorial Board for the international journals *Work and Stress*, *Journal of Organizational Behavior*, the *European Journal of Work & Organisational Psychology*, and the advisory board for the *International Journal of Rural Management*. She is Co-chair of the International Commission on Occupational Health Scientific Committee Work Organisation and Psychosocial Factors and was Chair of the 2014 Congress of the International Commission on Occupational Health – Work Organization and Psychosocial Factors. She is President-Elect of the Asia Pacific Academy for Psychosocial Factors at Work.

## Biography

Denise is Professor of Learning, Equity, Access and Participation at Central Queensland University. She also holds an adjunct senior research fellow position at the University of South Australia. Her qualifications include a PhD (Education), Master of Educational Technology, Master of Design, Graduate Certificate in Flexible Learning, Graduate Diploma in Social Sciences and a Bachelor of Arts in Social Work.

Denise's research focuses on the use of accessible information and communication technologies to increase social and educational participation. She has been awarded more than \$6 million in research income over the last five years and she is the project leader of a current \$2.974 million research project funded by the Australian Government, Department of Education, which aims to improve educational and employment outcomes of young people with disabilities, and a recently awarded grant of \$860,000 to improve pathways to education for Indigenous youth. She has been project leader of four Australian Government, Office for Learning and Teaching funded projects focusing on technology enhanced learning, including a current project focusing on the inclusive design of technology enhanced learning. She is also a chief investigator with the Young and Well Cooperative Research Centre focusing on participatory research involving people from special equity groups, especially young people from Indigenous communities.

Denise has authored/co-authored more than 100 peer reviewed journal publications, book chapters, conference papers and government reports, and she is a co-editor of a recently published book by Routledge focusing on Activity Theory, Authentic Learning and Emerging Technologies. She is also an Associate Editor of the Higher Education Research and Development Journal and peer reviewer of several high ranked journals. She has been an assessor for the Australian Government's learning and teaching grants and awards, and expert reviewer for the South African National Research Foundation and the United States National Science Foundation.

Her work in innovative teaching and learning, and accessibility solutions for students from special equity groups has been recognised with several awards including an Australian Learning and Teaching Council Citation for Outstanding Contributions to Student Learning, an SA Great Award, the inaugural 2010 Telstra-TJA Christopher Newell award for Telecommunications and Disability, and several University of South Australia awards including teaching excellence, equity, community engagement and an Education, Arts and Social Sciences Distinguished Academic Achievement Award.

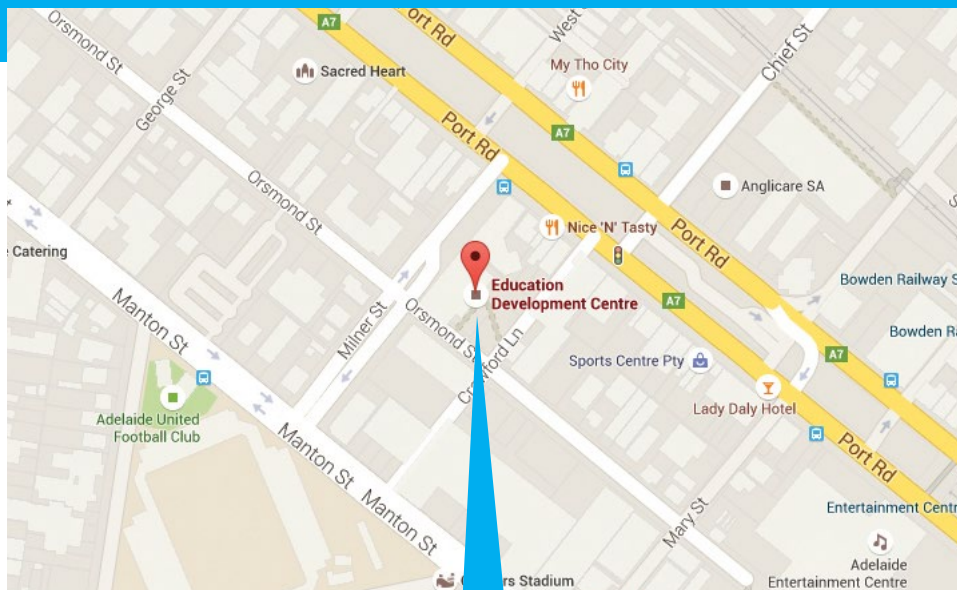

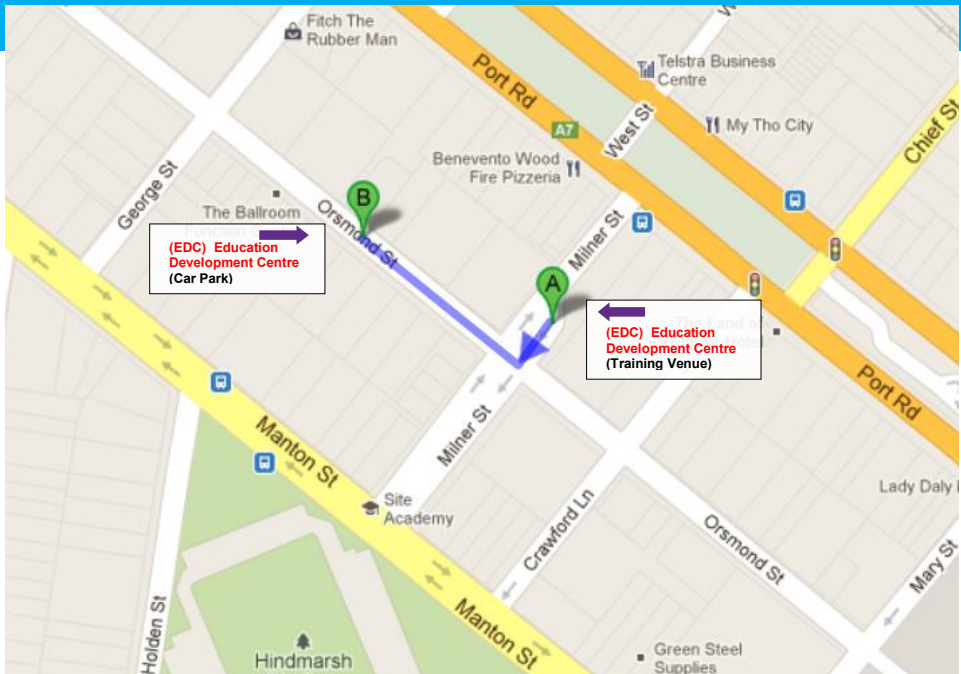

Bus numbers: 150/155/157 from North Terrace leaving the city every 15 minutes to STOP 7 on Port Road.

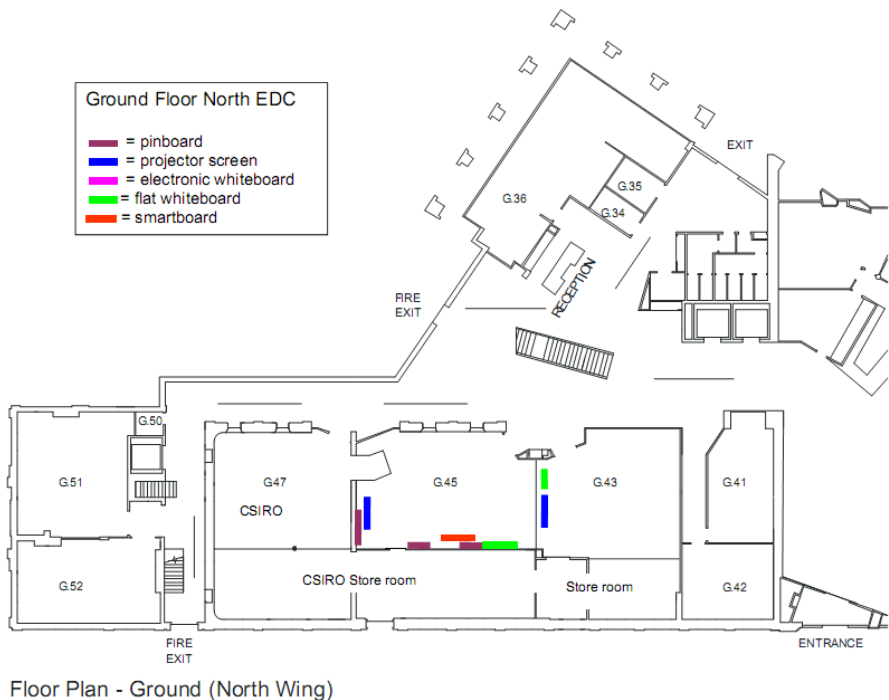
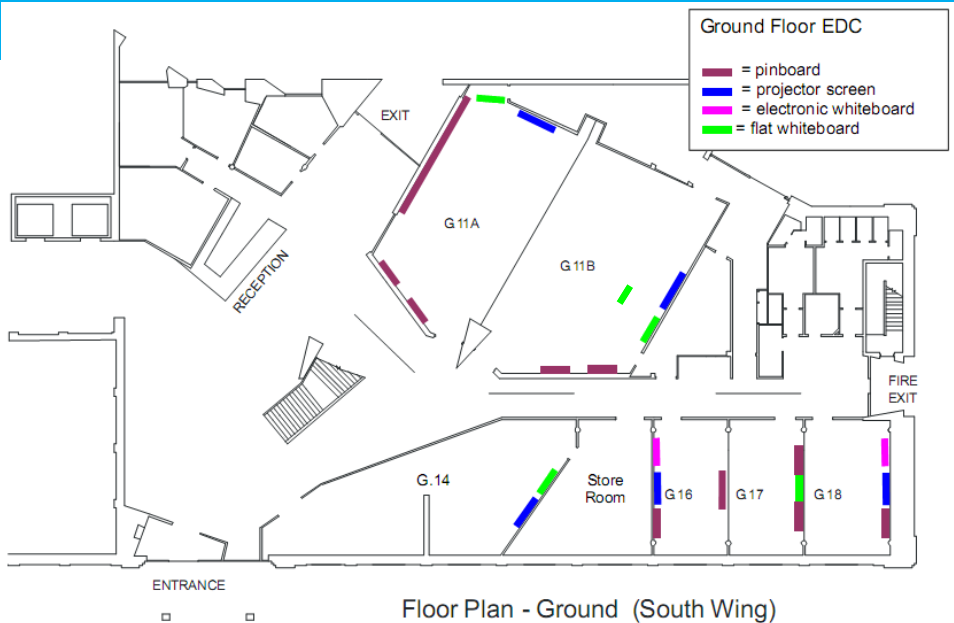
